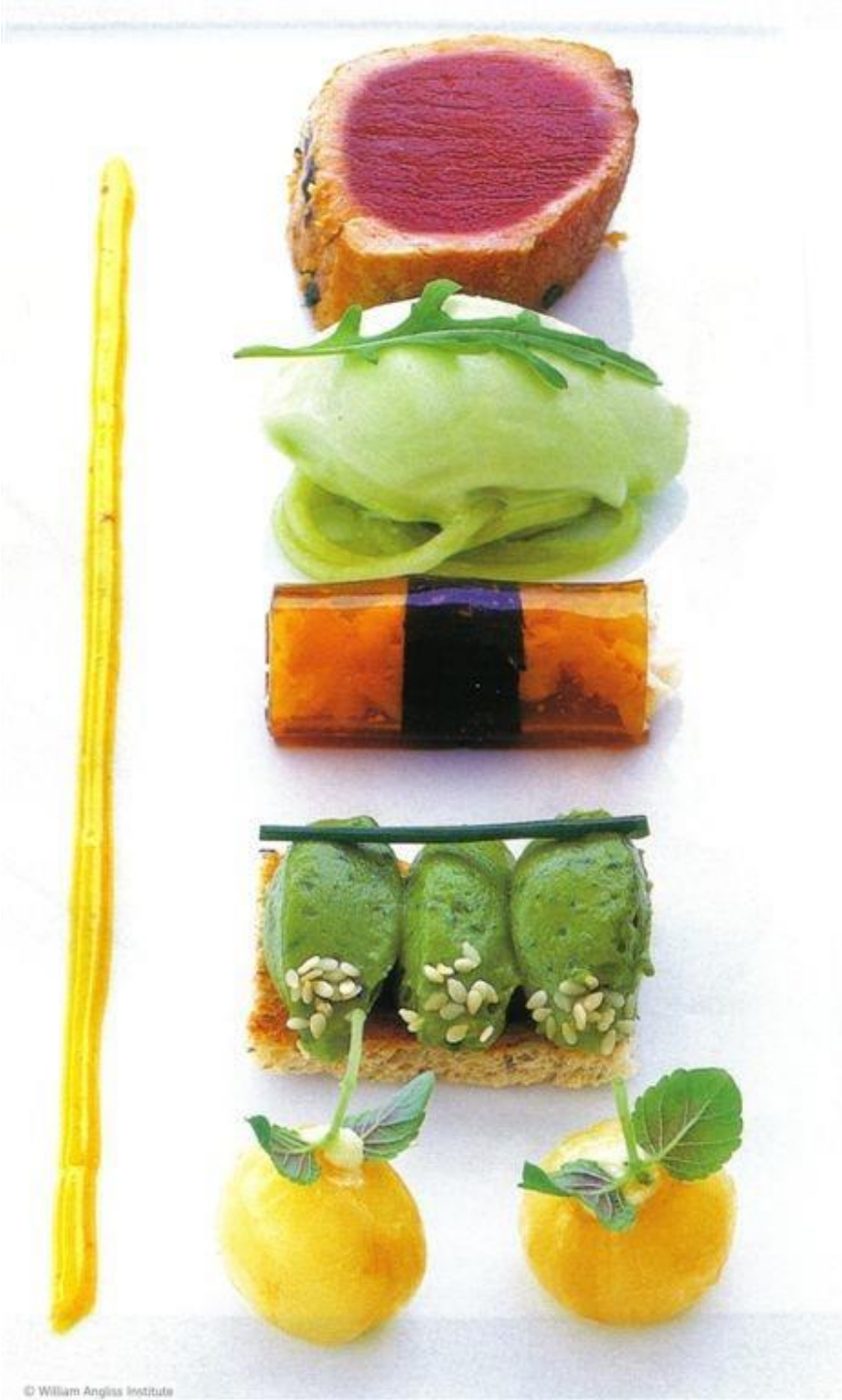
WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT?

- Students must complete a series of assessments during the semester and demonstrate that they have worked a minimum of 400 hours at the end of the semester.

- »» Completed at least one full-time year of study at an accredited tertiary institution
- »» Achieved at least a passing grade average, and
- »» An overall IELTS score of 6.0 (Academic module) with no band below 5.5.

Note: Selection and acceptance of students for industry placement, may be based on an interview process with participating employers.
